
3/16", 7/64", 3/32" Allen wrenches, Flat tip screwdriver, Small pliers

PROCEDURE AVERAGE TIME: 45 MINUTES

STEP 1 See <u>PIC.1</u>. Remove the Hypercharger from the motorcycle. Remove the front half, air filter, bearing cap assemblies, and butterflies. You will be left with the shell and butterfly shaft as shown above.

STEP 2 See <u>PIC.2</u>. Remove the circlip shown by the arrow. Remove the butterfly shaft.

STEP 3 Remove the three screws securing the aluminum vacuum pod cover to the back of the Hypercharger and remove the control rod/diaphragm assembly. See <u>PIC.3</u>.

STEP 4 See <u>PIC.4</u>. Install the new control rod/diaphragm assembly so the outer edge of the diphragm rests on the ledge inside the vacuum pod.

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STEP 5 See <u>PIC.5</u>. Place the retaining/seal ring in the vacuum pod. The entire edge of the diaphragm should now be trapped between the seal ring and the ledge in the pod.

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STEP 6 See <u>PIC.6</u>. Insert the rubber seal and spring. Be certain that the cutout in the seal lines up with the vacuum nipple.

STEP 7 See <u>PIC.7</u>. Place your finger on the end of the control rod that attaches to the butterfly shaft. While installing the pod cover, you must apply pressure to the arm to keep spring pressure from pulling the diaphragm out from between the ledge in the pod and the sealing ring. (You may need a friend's help here.) Install the pod cover.



STEP 8 See PIC.8. Attach the butterfly shaft to the control rod with the


small washer and e-clip. The butterfly shaft will be positioned in front of the actuating arm, and the actuating arm should point towards the bottom (slotted side) of the Hypercharger.

STEP 9 See <u>PIC.9</u>. Install the butterflies on to the shaft, and set the filter into place.


STEP 10 Install the front half of the Hypercharger. Install the bearing cap assemblies on to the completed cases. Note that the small

spring that was in the stock lower bearing cap will now be placed in the new lower "pro" bearing cap assembly. The word "PRO" should be upside down when you are seated on the bike.

STEP 11 Reinstall the Hypercharger on to the motorcycle in the same manner it was removed.
